For items authored by 1-20 authors, list every single one in the Reference List. For items authored by 21 or more authors, only list the first 19, put an ellipsis (...) and then list the final author, for a total of 20 names.

*The rules for multiple authors also apply to books and other forms of media.

A Little Welder Wisdom...

Think creatively about your search

terms. Maybe you can't find an article addressing the specific question "Is Peter Pan a Modern Myth or merely a Children's Fairy Tale?", but there are *countless* analyses of Peter Pan as a character, and about the breakdown of what makes something "a myth." Your paper, then, might require researching both and putting them together.

In short, be wary of the (very common) pitfall of expecting that someone has already done your research for you. You'll likely be frustrated and miss out on some really useful sources in the meantime.

A Little Welder Wisdom...

When searching the databases

(<u>https://libguide.umary.edu/az/databases</u>), open your search to related disciplines. For example, a topic of "work-life balance" may be for a business class, but that doesn't mean you should only search business databases. A lot of psychologists are *also* studying that topic, as are high-burnout professions such as nursing. Think outside the box!

Scriptural In-Text Citations

When citing scripture in your text, start with the name of the scripture, the original publication date and edition publication date, and then use book, chapter, and verse numbers rather than page numbers. Follow the conventional chapter/verse system of that religious text. Names of books within the scripture are usually abbreviated, and there is often a list of abbreviations at the beginning or end of the text.

Example: (King James Bible, 1769/2017, 1 Cor. 13:1).

About APA Style

The American Psychological Association (APA) style of citation primarily consists of in-text citations with a Reference list (bibliography) at the end of the project. There is guidance in the full handbook for how to make use of footnotes as needed within a project, but this is not commonly used, and not covered in this guide. The APA style is generally the preferred style for the sciences and education.

Formatting a Paper

For complete details, reference the official APA Publication Manual, 7th ed. You can also find a sample paper here: https://libguide.umary.edu/citations/APASamplePaper.

The general recommendations for formatting a paper are as follows:

- Margins should be 1" on all sides (running headers/page numbers not included)
- Number all pages using a running header in the upper right-hand corner. The title page is page number 1.
- Typeface must be easy to read, recommended is Times New Roman.
- Font size must be between 11-13pt. Most professors want 12pt.
- Center the title page. Use the same font as the rest of the paper.
- Position the title 3-4 lines down from the top of the page.
- Following the title, add one extra double-spaced line, and then list the following, each on its own line: Your name; School of Study (St. Gianna School of Health Sciences, etc., University of Mary; CLASS CODE: Full class name; Professor's name; Date of submission.
- On the first line of the paper's text, write the title of the paper in title case, bold, and centered. The rest of the text should be left-aligned and double-spaced, with the first line of each paragraph should be indented 0.5".
- At the top of your Reference list, center and the heading "References" at the top of the page. Bold the heading, but keep the font type and size the same as the rest of your paper.
- Start entries on the next double-spaced line (no extra spaces). Each entry should be flush with the left margin with a hanging indent of 0.5" after the first line.
