

CIVIC LEADERS FELLOWSHIP

Academic Advising Guide for **Philosophy Students**



The **Civic Leaders Fellowship** is a unique, semester-long opportunity for all full-time, undergraduate students at the University of Mary to join fellow scholars for intellectually rigorous leadership formation at **Arizona State University's School of Civic and Economic Thought and Leadership (SCETL)**. This fellowship is open to full-time undergraduate students at Mary — but especially those studying business administration, philosophy, politics, or economics.

Philosophy Requirements and Available SCETL Courses

Civic Leader Fellows may fulfill philosophy major/minor and bachelor's degree requirements with the following SCETL courses:

No single course can be used to satisfy more than one requirement.
